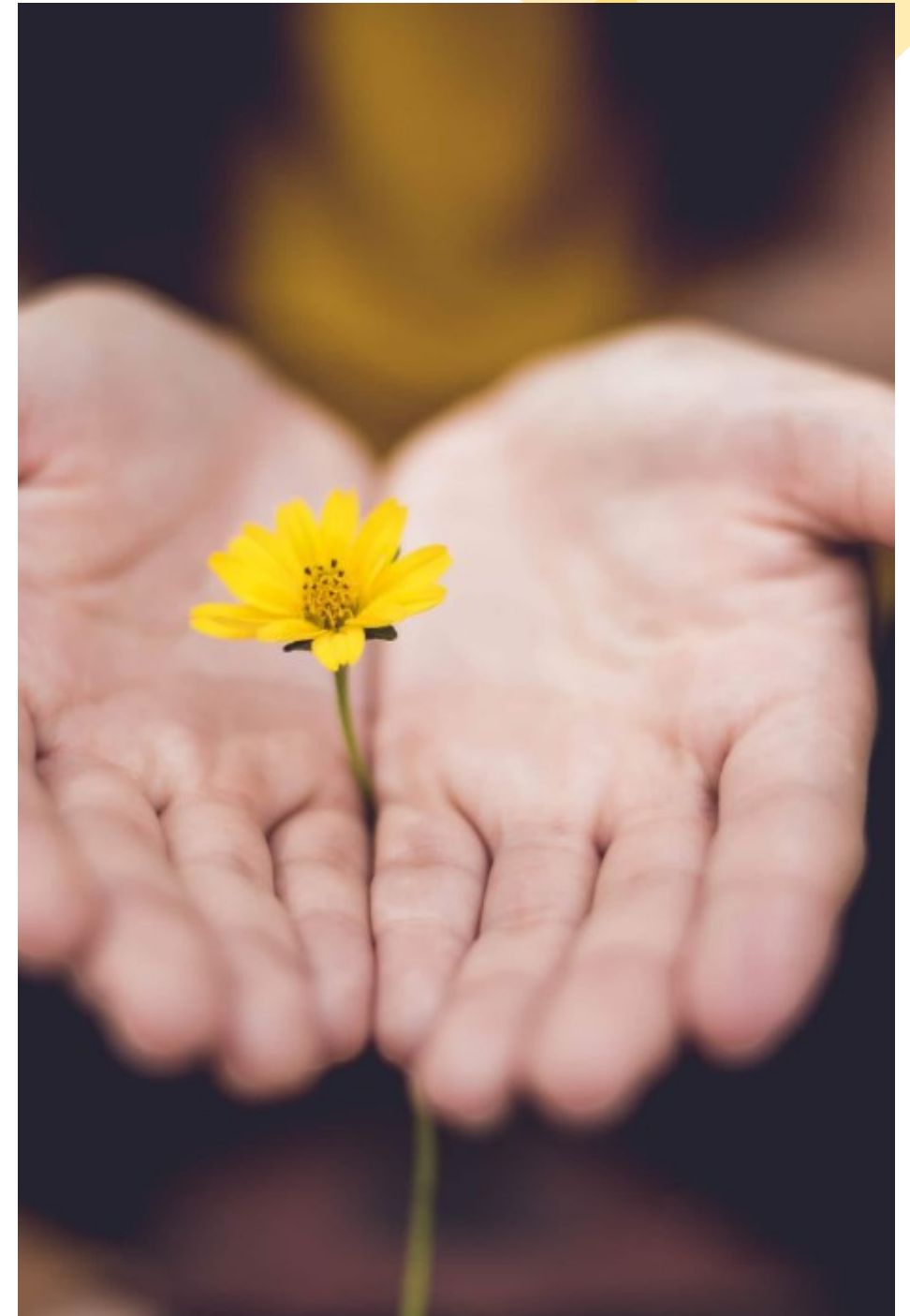
Bridging Futures Through Education

and cast a shadow over their future.

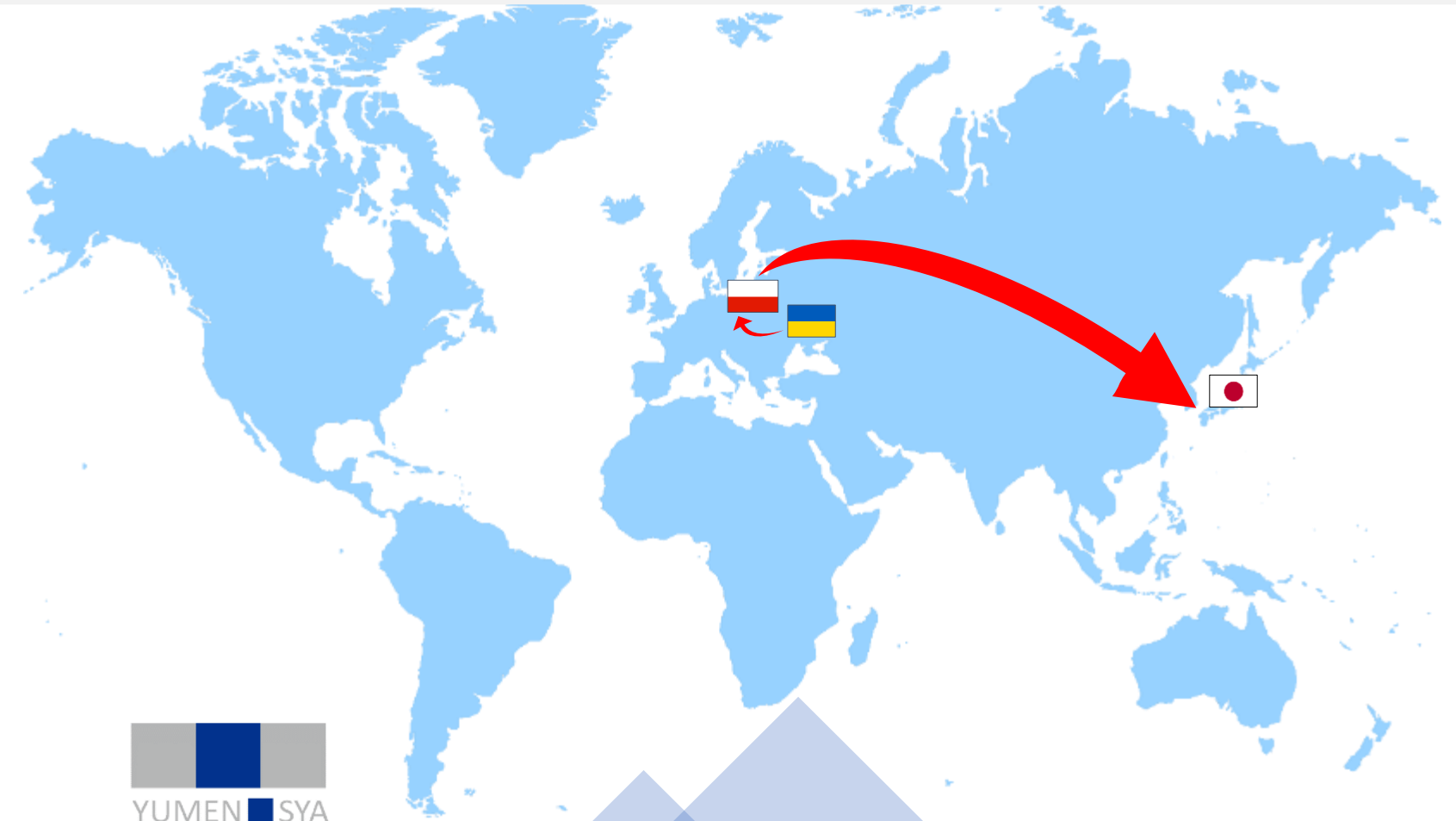
This project stands as a beacon of hope,

Background of the Project

The ongoing conflict in Ukraine has instigated an unprecedented crisis, forcing numerous people to flee their homes and find refuge in neighboring countries. In light of this, we have initiated a project to assist Ukrainian high school girls currently in Poland who aspire to continue their education in Japan. This project aims to offer them stability and opportunities for a brighter future.



Affected by the war, the future generation who have suffered physical and mental wounds will heal their scars in Japan and open the door to new hopes. Our role is to help them fulfill a bright mission as guides to peace and regain vitality in their lives.

Liberation from the Impact of War

The young female students who evacuated from Ukraine have lost their hometown and stable education due to the war. We believe in their talents and their future, and we are here to support their liberation.

Providing Opportunities for Education

Through schooling in Japan, we aim to create an environment where they can learn with peace of mind and maximize their potential. Meikou Academy in Ōmuta City will serve as the stage for this initiative.

Fostering Future Possibilities

As a part of the Yume no Sha's project to foster bonds that protect the celestial lands, we actively promote support to pave the way for their bright future, creating opportunities to carve out new paths in life.

Support Overview

- **Target Recipients:** Ukrainian refugee girls who are eager to study in Japan and are currently in Poland.
- **Number of students to support :** 3
- **Start date in Japan:** From January 2024 onwards
- **School Destination:** Meikou Gakuen (Omuta City, Fukuoka Prefecture)
- **Support period:** About one year
 - * Depending on the situation or circumstances, we may consider shortening the duration (e.g., to six months) .
 - * It is also possible to extend the duration by three years and aim to obtain graduation qualifications from a school in Japan.
However, we will make an appropriate assessment considering the motivation to study in Japan, Japanese language proficiency, and academic ability.
- **Residence:** Newly established dormitory provided at Meikou Gakuen
- **Insurance coverage:** Health and disability insurance are available (Costs are covered by the project)
- **Support Details:** Schooling support, travel expense support, Japanese language learning support, living expense & tuition fee support, life support & care, repatriation support, etc.
- **Supporting Organizations:** Yumenosya Foundation, Polish Chamber of Commerce and Industry in Japan, Canossian Daughters of Charity JAPAN, Meikou Gakuen, and others

Support Activities for Ukrainian Refugees

As a part of the "Protecting the heaven's earth Bond" project by the General Incorporated Foundation Yume No Sha, we have been initiating activities since 2022 to support individuals who have fled due to the invasion of Ukraine by Russia. Through empathy and service to the victims of war, prayers and healing for the wounded, human rights protection for refugees and migrants, and the promotion of peace activities, we are healing the wounds of war and supporting people as new messengers of peace.

Initiatives for Ukrainian Refugees:

- Hosting gatherings for children in cooperation with the Ukrainian Orthodox Church and the Catholic Diocese of Nagoya: May 5, 2022, Catholic Chikaramachi Church
- Co-hosting the Ukrainian Refugee Support Charity Concert "Prayers for Peace": May 5, 2022, National Olympic Memorial Youth Center
- Providing stationery to Ukrainian refugees
- Assisting in job placement for Ukrainian refugees who have taken refuge in Japan
